Course Overview

Would you know how to react in the event of a terrorist attack?

Whenever there is a shooting, stabbing or bomb explosion, the initial priority is understandably to ensure public safety, which can unfortunately cause delays to the emergency services being able to reach the injured.

The QA Level 2 Award in citizenAID (RQF) has been specifically developed to help members of the public learn life-saving skills for use in these extreme situations. Based on the citizenAID phone App and pocket guide, this regulated qualification is designed to teach people how to react safely, prioritise the injured and give first aid to victims in the event of a deliberate multiple casualty incident.

During this 3 hour course, candidates will have the opportunity to practise techniques for dealing with catastrophic bleeding and will be equipped with the skills and knowledge needed to save lives in the aftermath of a terrorist attack.

 - Knife attacker or active shooter
 - Exploded bomb

- 1. These terms and conditions are between PHOTON (training center name of Photon Cleaning) and the Customer. They replace any previous terms and conditions of PHOTON and are the complete and only terms and conditions between the parties. All dealings between PHOTON and the Customer shall be governed by these terms and conditions which shall prevail over any others.
- **2.** These terms and conditions and any contract formed pursuant to them may be varied provided any variation is confirmed in writing by an authorised representative of PHOTON.
- 3. A binding contract will be formed when PHOTON notifies its acceptance of a Customer's order for goods or services (the 'Contract'). An invoice may be dispatched or emailed prior to delivery of the goods or performance of the services and shall be payable on whichever date is sooner, within 30 days of the date of the invoice, or 14 days prior to the commencement of the earliest course. If the booking is made less than 14 days prior to the commencement of a training course, payment is due before the course commences.
- 4. Subject to compliance with paragraph 5, if the Customer is dealing as a consumer then they may cancel the Contract in accordance with the Consumer Contracts (Information, Cancellation and Additional Changes) Regulations 2013 up to the end of the 14th day from the date of receipt of the goods or the booking of a course (the 'Cancellation Date'). The Customer must notify PHOTON in writing on or before the Cancellation Date by letter, fax or e-mail and (in the case of goods) comply with the returns policy set out at paragraph 5. This does not affect your statutory rights. If the course is due to start within 14 days of the booking, cancellation must be received by PHOTON prior to the commencement date of the course.
- **5.** To return goods the Customer must have a goods return number ('GRN'). A GRN can be obtained by telephoning PHOTON and providing the invoice number. A GRN will then be provided, together with instructions for returning the goods. PHOTON will not accept returns without a valid GRN. All returned items must be in their original packaging, unopened and unused and returned within 14 days of the date of issue of the GRN. The Customer must pay for the costs of return unless the goods are faulty, damaged or incorrectly supplied and will be liable for them until they reach PHOTON.

On receipt of the returned goods, PHOTON will credit the Customer's account with any sum debited as soon as possible.

- 6. In the case of the provision of a training course by PHOTON, certificates to prove completion of the course may be withheld by PHOTON until payment is made. No refund shall be given and the full course fee shall remain payable should a delegate fail any course provided by PHOTON and PHOTON make no guarantee as to a delegate successfully passing any course. If a delegate does not attend the full course fee shall remain payable and no refund shall be given. It is the Customer's responsibility to ensure that a delegate is booked on and attends the correct course. If a delegate attends a course and payment has not yet been made, the Customer accepts that payment is overdue.
- 7. Subject to paragraph 4, if the Customer wishes to cancel a booking, the Customer must notify PHOTON in writing by registered letter or e-mail ('Notice of Cancellation'). For the avoidance of doubt, Notice of Cancellation will not be accepted by telephone. If PHOTON receives a Notice of Cancellation more than 10 working days prior to the commencement of the course a full refund of any course fees paid shall be given (with no cancellation penalty due). If PHOTON receives a Notice of Cancellation less than 10 working days prior to the commencement of the course the full course fee shall remain payable and no refund shall be given.
- 8. Unless specified, Value Added Tax will not be included in any price
- 9. Interest on overdue invoices may be charged (at the discretion of PHOTON) in accordance with the Late Payment of Commercial Debts (Interest) Act 1998 until the date of payment and the Customer agrees to pay any reasonable expenses (not limited to expenses fixed by Court) incurred by PHOTON in pursuing any outstanding debt or debts due from the Customer.
- 10. Title to the goods shall pass when payment is made in full. For the purposes of payment of PHOTON's invoice only, time is of the essence. Until payment is made in full the Customer shall allow PHOTON or its agents to enter its premises during business hours to inspect any goods which have not been paid for in full and remove them. The Customer shall not sell, give, pledge, lend, charge or otherwise dispose of the goods before title has passed without the written agreement of PHOTON.
- 11. Risk of loss shall pass on delivery and all delivery times are estimates only.

- **12.** It is the Customer's responsibility to inspect the goods on delivery. Any visible defects in the goods must be notified to PHOTON within 7 days of delivery during which time PHOTON shall repair or replace such goods free of charge. After this time any goods with visible defects may be replaced at the Customer's expense.
- 13. Nothing in these terms shall operate to exclude or limit PHOTON's liability for death or personal injury caused by its negligence, any breach of the terms implied by section 12 of the Sale of Goods Act 1979 or section 2 of the Supply of Goods and Services Act 1982 or fraud.
- 14. PHOTON shall not be liable to the Customer whether in contract, tort (including negligence) or otherwise for any loss of profit; anticipated profits; revenues; anticipated savings; goodwill or business opportunity; or for any indirect or consequential loss or damage whatsoever or for any failure to comply with its obligations due to an event beyond PHOTON's reasonable control. PHOTON's aggregate liability to the Customer whether in contract, tort (including negligence) or otherwise shall in no circumstances exceed the total sum paid or payable by the Customer to PHOTON under the Contract.
- **15.** PHOTON shall not be liable for mistreatment of any person or property arising out of the Customer's failure to follow the guidelines set out by PHOTON in its publications or courses.
- **16.** PHOTON reserve the right to cancel and/or amend course dates, times, contents and venues. Every effort will be made to give the Customer as much notice as possible and offer a reasonable alternative. If these are not satisfactory, PHOTON shall refund in full the price of the course. No further compensation will be given.
- 17. The Customer shall indemnify PHOTON for any loss or expenses caused as a result of providing inaccurate information to PHOTON, mistakes contained within the Customer's order, changes to the Contract requested by the Customer or personal injury or death caused by the Customer not following PHOTON's guidelines correctly.
- **18.** If the Customer becomes bankrupt or enters into liquidation, administration or administrative receivership or has a receiver of any of its assets appointed (or ceases or threatens to cease carrying on business) PHOTON shall be entitled to cancel any outstanding Contract(s) without liability to the Customer and any sums outstanding shall become immediately due and payable.

- 19. If the parties are unable to resolve any dispute arising between them, either party may initiate an alternative dispute resolution procedure with the assistance of a mediator agreed by the parties or, in default of such agreement, appointed at the request of either party by the Centre for Dispute Resolution or such other similar body as is agreed.
- **20.** Any written notice given under these terms and conditions shall be served either by registered post or by facsimile to the relevant party's registered/principal office or last known address.
- **21.** No other person or body who is not a party to the Contract has any rights under the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 to enforce any terms of the Contract.
- **22.** These terms and conditions shall be governed and construed in accordance with English law and the parties submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English Courts.

FAQ

Translators

Delegates need a good understanding of spoken English to complete our courses. Delegates are permitted to bring a bilingual dictionary into assessments, however mobile phones are not allowed. If a translator is required, please call us for advice.

Disabilities

If a delegate feels that changes may be needed to a course or its assessment because of a disability, please inform us as soon as possible. Ideally this should be prior to booking in order to allow us enough time to assess these considerations and implement any adjustments.

What should I wear?

The dress code for courses is casual – students are advised to wear trousers or jeans (not skirts or dresses) due to the practical nature of many courses. If you have long hair it may be helpful to bring something to tie it back (although this is not essential).

Do I need to bring anything to the course?

As the majority of our courses lead to a regulated qualification, all delegates are required to bring **photographic identification** (such as a passport or driving licence) when attending a course.

What if I miss some of the course or arrive late?

You must attend the full course to gain certification. Delegates arriving late may be turned away at the instructor's discretion – the full course fee will remain payable in this event. Please telephone us on 07871350526 if there are any problems of this nature.
